

## Member Events – Photo Summary

With Covid almost in our rearview mirror, the Playing Committee held a full schedule of member events in 2022. Please check out the following photos & Scoresheets which capture the winners and, in some instances, the ‘first losers’ in our 2022 events. Over the course of the season, Cedarhill was host to several, very successful events.

Our season was launched with a newly revised *Getting-Acquainted Opening Scramble*. We had 103 participants. The previous year we only had 52 members participate. The new format introduced more games of chance on the course (we brought back chipping into a floating pool on the 16<sup>th</sup> pond and played once again the game of Chase-the-Ace. We also held a raffle for a new Odyssey putter. Greg White, our CPGA Pro was able to obtain a heavily discounted putter from Callaway as the prize (a value of \$400) – won by Ross McEwan. Once we covered the cost of the putter from the ticket sales, the remaining funds were used for a 50/50 draw, with 50% going to the winner selected at random (Maureen McLewin). The remaining 50% was given to a registered charity selected by a member (Wendy Buchanan), who was selected randomly, and that person was given the tax receipt for the amount. The charity selected was World Central Kitchen. Cedarhill provided a complimentary lunch of hamburgers, jumbo hot dogs (with all the fixings), house salad, pasta salad and coleslaw.

Look for the return of this very successful event in 2023.

Once the Members got in a few rounds, we held our first member event on Saturday, May 28<sup>th</sup> – a **Solheim Cup** event for the Ladies and a **Ryder Cup** event for the Men. We had a very good turnout for both, with 24 Ladies and 32 Men playing.

On Saturday, June 4<sup>th</sup>, we held our first mixed event – the **Mixed Chapman Scramble**. We had 44 golfers playing in mixed twosomes. The event was won by Kathy and Tom Pulcine.

The **Men’s Cedarhill Cup** was held on Thursday, July 14<sup>th</sup>, and Sat/Sun July 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup>. There were 32 Men who took part over the 3 rounds of match formats – the first one being a two-person best ball, the second a two-person scramble and the last one being individual matches. Marty Wells and Tom Pulcine captained the two teams. After 3 rounds, the two teams tied at 32-32.

On July 16<sup>th</sup>, the Ladies played a **Ladies’ Scramble**. Twenty ladies were broken down into 5 evenly matched teams...and were they even...at the end of the round, 2 teams had a gross score of 75 and 3 teams were 76. Using the team handicaps to a decimal point, confirmed the winning foursome to be Susan Gillean, Karen Acton, Donna Tallon and Bonnie Zuran.

The very popular **2-Person Scramble** event was held on June 25<sup>th</sup>. We had 50 members who played (16 Ladies and 34 Men). On the Men's side, Mathew Banning and Adam Rehman won the event shooting an impressive 62 gross (60 net). The Ladies' side also saw impressive play by Stephanie Lemaire and Karen Acton (70 gross, 61 net).

The **Men's OVGA Intersectional** was played on Sunday, July 10, 2022, at Petawawa. The golf clubs playing in Division I were Petawawa (Host), Cedarhill, Mont Cascade and Canadian. The winning club was Petawawa with 43 points. Finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> and hosting next year was Canadian with 36 points. Cedarhill finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> with 22 points and Mont Cascade finished 4<sup>th</sup> with 19 points. Cedarhill will remain in Division I and will travel to the Canadian next year. The benchmark for outstanding play is a player winning all their matches and taking six (6) points – accomplishing this for Cedarhill was Mathew Banning.

The **Ladies' OVGA Intersectional** was played on Sunday, July 17, 2027, at Cedarhill. Playing in Division F were Cedarhill (Host), Lombard Glen, Rockland and Pembroke. Pembroke finished 2<sup>nd</sup> with 25 points, Cedarhill finished 3<sup>rd</sup> with 16 points and Lombard Glen finished 4<sup>th</sup> with 10 points. The benchmark for outstanding play is a player winning all their matches and taking six (6) points – accomplishing this for Cedarhill was Jill Finlin.
